The agency's RESILIENCE has kept us going through these most difficult of times. We are open and offering all services with the necessary CDC guidelines in place. With the onslaught of COVID-19, we quickly developed a strategic plan and reconfigured our entrance point so that all staff, clients and visitors have one single entrance to the facility.

Everyone is temperature checked and MUST wear masks at all times. In this area, we also have the clinical director and consumer services facilitator's offices that provide case management services. In order to adhere to social distancing guidelines, it was necessary to reconfigure the layout of our training area.

Since the virus began, there has been a vast increase for help from persons with mental health conditions. The high rate of

unemployment has created a desperate need for food support as well. The social isolation associated with the COVID-19 lockdown has exacerbated their chronic mental health issues.

We have expanded and enhanced our peer support staff to meet this need. The agency has also expanded its food distribution program to accommodate many clients and their families who are experiencing food insecurity and shortages. The United Way of Palm Beach County provided the funds to purchase a large stand-alone freezer so we can keep perishable foods for longer periods of time.

It is important to note that many previous donors are now designating their funds to targeted COVID-19 causes; however we still need everyone's support and help.

We applaud and thank those of you who have stepped up and donated to the cause. However, there is still a great need especially among those whom we serve.


